The 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of the International Forestry Quarantine Research Group (IFQRG) will be held as a virtual symposium on four consecutive Fridays starting September 2, 2022 (skipping Sept 23 because of a conflict with the first International Plant Health Conference). Phytosanitary treatments

Surveillance tools for forest pests – development of new lures and new technology

Development of guidance for ISPMs related to forestry
